	<p style="text-align: center;">He is a shrewd, fair man. He permits smoking in the court room, but he does not smoke. He is known to occasionally eat an entire cigar. He is judge at Tom's trial.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">He is a witness at the trial for Tom Robinson. He is a good man and he covers for Boo Radley when Boo saves Jem and Scout. He is a decent man who tries to protect the innocent from danger. He is the sheriff of Maycomb.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">She lives across the street from the Finch's. She is very fond of the Finch children and treats them like adults. She is one of only a few people who really support Atticus in defending Tom Robinson. She defends Boo Radley's right to remain in his house</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">She believes that by dressing well, using manners, and being social, she is a true lady. She has very strict, traditional ideas of how society works and the role a Southern woman should play. She is concerned with raising Atticus's children 'properly' and takes care of them during the trial.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">He appears at school on Scout's first day. Filthy and rude, he declares that he won't come to school again that year. Chuck Little describes him as 'a mean one, a hard-down mean one'.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">A poor, white girl who tries to look after seven siblings. Despite her squalid living conditions she tries hard to be clean and tidy. She grew red geraniums to brighten up her home. She has no friends. She accuses Tom Robinson of raping her.</p>

	<p>A rough man, described 'as a little bantam cock'. He uses his social security money for drink and neglects his family. He is racist, ignorant and filled with hate. He is proved to be a liar at the trial. He plots revenge on the Finch's.</p>
	<p>He is a recluse who was emotionally damaged by his cruel father. Many rumours circulated about him and children were afraid to go near his house. He watches life in Maycomb from his house. He grows to love Jem and Scout. He is the Finch's secret protector. His real name is Arthur Radley.</p>
	<p>A black man who lives on the outskirts of Maycomb with his wife and young children. He worked for Mr Link Deas for eight years. His left arm is crippled. He is accused of rape. He is killed when trying to escape from prison.</p>
	<p>She is firm but kind. She does not know how old she is. She taught Scout how to write. Atticus sees her as part of the family. Atticus depends upon her. She is the Finch's black cook.</p>
	<p>His real name is Charles Baker Harris. He has seen the movie Dracula. He is Scout's 'fiancé'. He comes to stay in Maycomb with his aunt during the summer. He sobs during the trial. He wants justice and is anti-racist.</p>
	<p>He tells Scout to never talk to him in school. His sister describes him as having 'a naturally tranquil disposition and a slow fuse'. The first thing we hear about in the novel is that he has a broken arm. He was furious with Mrs Dubose and beheaded all her camellias. He is Scout's older brother.</p>
	<p>He is a stable and mature figure. His wife has died and he is bringing up two young children on his own. He is a wise, compassionate lawyer and a loving father. He is kind and caring and always sees the best in others. He is scrupulously honest.</p>
	<p>She is intelligent and inquisitive but she hates school because she is bored. She is well meaning and thinks the best of others. She is a tomboy. She has a close relationship with her father and brother. She is the narrator.</p>
